The fund is invested in the Standard Life Investments Global SICAV China Equities Fund which aims to provide long term growth and is designed for investors who are looking for exposure to the Chinese equity market. The fund invests predominantly in equities of corporations domiciled in the People's Republic of China or companies that derive the majority of their revenues or profits from Chinese operations or have a significant proportion of their assets there. This may include equities that are listed domestically or overseas or investment in companies with Variable Interest Entity (VIE) structures to gain exposure to industries with foreign ownership restrictions. The fund is actively managed by our investment team, who will select stocks to try to take advantage of opportunities they have identified.

The value of investments within the fund can fall as well as rise and is not guaranteed - you may get back less than you pay in. The fund may use derivatives for the purposes of efficient portfolio management, reduction of risk or to meet its investment objective if this is permitted and appropriate. 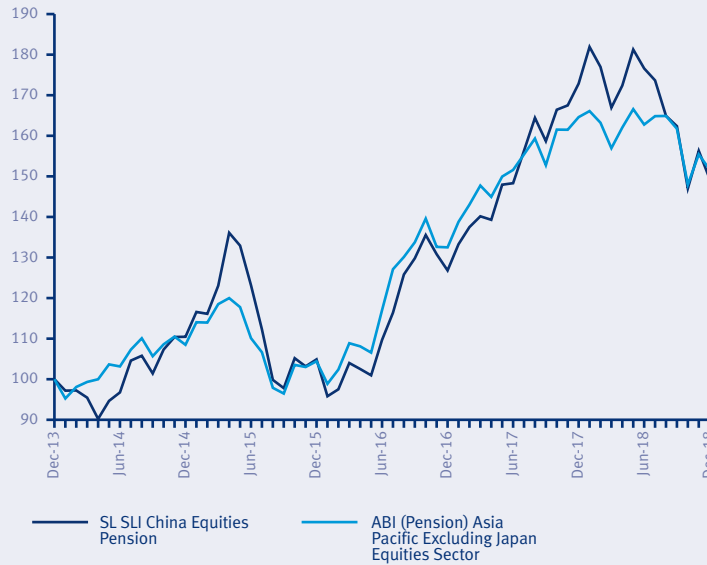
